- Coordinate Mutual Aid for Region 2 (LE, Fire and EMS)
- Deliver emergency communications and notifications through media and warning systems

HOW TO FIND US


Search for "AC Alert" or "Alameda County" in the App.



LOGGING IN/SIGNING UP

If you have an account set up with AC Alert, put in your username and password. If you have not signed up you are able to sign up through the App!






A rapid notification software used in Alameda County to alert residents of an emergency.

Benefits:

- Allows for multiple contact methods and pathways
- Allows for multiple points/addresses of interest
- Non-emergency notifications (e.g., events, road closures)*

Evacuation Terminology

- Standardized Language throughout State of California
 - Evacuation ORDER: Immediate threat to life. This is a lawful order to leave now. The area is lawfully closed to public access.
 - Evacuation <u>WARNING</u>: Potential threat to life and/or property. Those who require additional time to evacuate, and those with pets and livestock should leave now.
 - Shelter in Place: Go indoors. Shut and lock doors and windows. Prepare to self-sustain until further notice and/or contacted by emergency personnel for additional direction.

DON'T WAIT TO EVACUATE!

If you feel unsafe, self-evacuate;

DO NOT WAIT to be told to leave.
